Dear Gibbsboro School families,

A goal of the Gibbsboro School Language Arts teachers is to foster a love of reading and to create lifelong readers. The summer months provide an opportunity to extend and enrich your child's reading experiences and prevent the loss of reading skills. Consider the following facts about reading:

Teachers typically spend between 4 to 6 weeks re-teaching material students have forgotten over the summer. (Lasting Consequences of the Summer Learning Gap, Karl Alexander, Doris Entwistle, Linda Steffel Olson, April 2007.)

Children who read four or more books over the summer fare better on reading-comprehension tests in the fall than their peers who read one or no books over the summer. (Summer Reading and the Ethnic Achievement Gap, Jimmy Kim, Journal of Education for Students Placed at Risk, 2004.) Reading as a leisure activity is the best predictor of comprehension, vocabulary and reading speed. (The Power of Reading, Stephen Krashen, Libraries Unlimited, 1993.)

We hope that our students will read many books over the summer, but this summer we are requiring each grade to read **ONE** book from the lists below.
